## ART NiGHT

**SAVE THE DATE - ART NiGHT is coming** on Thursday evening, March 19. We will be creating and trading ATCs, so bring your creativity and energy!

What are ATCs? Artist trading cards (or ATCs) are miniature works of art about the same size as modern trading cards baseball cards, or 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> by 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches. The ATC movement originated in Switzerland. In general, cards are produced in a variety of media, including pencil sketches, watercolors and collages.
